When

Indexes touch, make a circle with left index

fingertips; return

tip-to-tip



Note: show a quizzical expression on face

Where

Hold up the index finger, like you're indicating "one," then shake it side to side

Note: eyebrows move downward while showing quizzical expression on face when asking question



Thumb of "L" on chin;

wiggle index finger

Note: show a quizzical expression on face while sign "who"



Rock

wrist back &

forth

Who

Palm-in fingers of open hand on forehead, move out to palm-in "Y"

Note: show a quizzical expression on face



Knuckles of palm-down bent hands touching roll hands from inward to outward ending palm- up

How



The left "S" hand, thumb side up, rests in the open right palm. In the position the left hand is pushed up a short distance by the right hand





Careful

ha

Make two "K" hands & turning your hands sideways (pinkie-sides down), place one "K" hand on top of the other, & tap a few times





Sick, ill

Open 5 hand, bent middle fingers, touch right on the





Rest, Relax

(The folded arms: a position of rest.) With palms facing the body, the arms are folded across the chest

Weight

The fingers of the right "H" hand are centered on the left index finger or "H" hand & rocked back & forth









Cold, Shivering, Chilled Make fists with both hands & hold them at

shoulder level, then shake your fists & arms as if you're shivering in the cold

Hot

"C' hand shape with either hand. While holding the "C" position, place your fingertips just under your nose & your thumb tip just under your bottom lip. Quickly move your hand away from your mouth & twist your wrist so that your fingertips are facing away from your body



Cough

Feel, Feeling

The middle finger, touching the heart moves upward.(Feelings- move twice)

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Tired, Exhausted

Flat "B" hand touch near chest arc downward, move body downward like you're tired



















Wake-up

Both hands are closed, with thumb & index finger of each hand held together, extended & placed at the corners of the closed eyes. Slowly, they separate, & the eyes open





Thirsty

The index finger moves down the throat a short distance



Water

Index finger of palm left "W" taps chin



Eat, Food

The closed right hand goes through the natural motion of placing food in the mouth,

twice

Wait

With both hands, make the open"5" hand, palms facing up & fingertips curled, & wiggle



Problem

The knuckles of the curved index & middle fingers of both hands are rubbed up & down against each other, Instead of the an alternate clockwise/counterclockwise manner















Thumb &

index finger

at mouth,

then write

on left palm

Sister

<u>Sister-</u>Touch your chin with an "L" hand shape & then tap your hand on top of the other "L" hand shape



Brothers

<u>Brother-</u>Touch your forehead with an "L" hand shape & then tap your hand on top of the other "L" hand shape



Girl/Gal/Female- As in the picture, the girls wore bonnets. Use "A" hand-shape & slide the "A" hand shape along your cheek

Boy, Male

<u>Boy/Male-</u>Take hold of the brim of the cap (baseball cap). Use the sign for "No" but all finger touch your

thumb & your forehead
